Policy Statement

DSE Civil Electrical (DSECE) aim to achieve a high standard of environmental care in conducting its operations. Our approach to environmental management seeks continuous improvement in performance by considering evolving industry knowledge and community expectations.

The directors and management of DSECE acknowledge that the nature of the business operations may have an impact on the environment and that legal and moral obligations must be addressed to avoid environmental damage or deterioration.

DSECE is committed to continuous improvement and compliance with environmental management legislation and regulations, and to the modification of its business practices as legislation and regulations is amended. To support this DSECE have implemented an Integrated Management System (IMS) that complies with ISO 14001.

This will include all works DSE undertake including but not limited to –

- Construction and civil activities
- Emergency repairs and maintenance works
- Electrical works
- Subcontractor and supplier engagement

Managers and supervisors will ensure that the planning of all work processes considers protection of the environment and they will continue to identify aspects of the operation where such protection can be improved by the changing of process methods and activities.

Our Environmental objectives are set to achieve:

- Compliance with all applicable laws, regulations and standards and where laws do not adequately protect the environment, apply standards and best practice to minimise potentially adverse environmental impacts
- Communicate openly with the government and community on environmental issues, including significant impacts, and where possible, contribute to the development of policies, legislation and regulations that may affect DSECE.
- Ensure that systems identify, control and monitor environmental risks arising from operations.
- Establish programs to conserve resources, minimise wastes and protect the environment.
- The prevention of pollution of the atmosphere, the land and the immediate surroundings on and in which
 business operations are carried out, wherever possible and practicable, the recycling of waste, and where
 recycling is not possible or practicable, ensuring that waste is disposed of in a manner which protects the
 environment.
